Park Naturalizations

The Park Naturalizations program continues to be instrumental in preserving and expanding our urban forest. In 2023, our dedicated team achieved remarkable progress by planting an impressive 5,848 woodland plants across 23 locations in the city.

These figures highlight our collective commitment to enhancing the ecological integrity and resilience of our local parks. The impact of planting thousands of trees and shrubs extends far beyond mere aesthetics. It significantly contributes to the health of our local ecosystem, creating a more vibrant and sustainable

Preserving and growing the urban forest is not just a task for one organization but requires a collective effort. In 2023, we engaged 1,090 volunteers, whose involvement has been crucial to our success.

Neighbourhood ReLeaf

In 2023, ReForest London significantly expanded its efforts, hosting 27 tree giveaway events—an increase from previous years. As a result, a remarkable 5,333 new trees were distributed to 1,615 households across the city, marking a substantial 125% increase in trees distributed and a 50% increase in households reached compared to last year.

Our team also continues to provide essential guidance on tree care, empowering Londoners in their tree stewardship.

Tree giveaway events serve as catalysts for community engagement, empowering individuals to actively contribute to a greener and healthier environment.

Mini Forests

In 2023, ReForest London
planted London's first two
Mini Forests at Mount
Pleasant Cemetery and the
Sisters of the Precious Blood
Monastery, marking a
significant milestone in
Canadian urban reforestation.

Mini Forests, or Miyawaki
Forests, are densely planted areas using native species to recreate natural ecosystems.
Developed by Japanese botanist Dr. Akira Miyawaki, these forests grow up to ten times faster than traditional methods, becoming self-sustaining within a few years and are essential for providing habitats for diverse flora and fauna, effectively sequestering carbon dioxide

lowering temperatures in urban areas, filtering pollutants to improve air and water quality, and engaging community members in environmental stewardship.

These pioneering Mini Forests set a precedent for future urban reforestation projects across Ontario and Canada, reinforcing ReForest London's commitment to a greener, healthier, and more resilient city.

Trees for Teachers

Schoolyards always benefit from having more trees, and we recognize that shaping the values and understanding of the next generation is crucial for advancing environmental initiatives.

Our Trees for Teachers program not only adds shade trees to school grounds but also empowers teachers to guide students in selecting the right tree species and planting locations.

In 2023, we offered professional development workshops that attracted 42 educators from across the city, providing a total of 204 hours of programming. These workshops equip teachers with the knowledge and tools to seamlessly integrate environmental education into their teaching. They also inspire students to actively participate in environmental conservation.

This year, 47 schools and 2,067 students took part in the program, fostering a culture of environmental awareness and responsibility within the community.

Westminster Ponds Centre

2023 saw some remarkable changes come to the Westminster Ponds Centre (WPC).

Thanks to the support of our generous funders, we were able to complete a number of key renovation projects, allowing us to improve accessibility to the Bruce Pavilion.

These upgrades included the installation of an accessible parking space and ramp, a critical step in eliminating physical barriers to those wishing to participate in the extensive environmental programming at the WPC.

In addition to the ramp and accessible parking space, we replaced the out-of-date washroom facilities with 3 brand new universal washrooms and 1 barrier free washroom, created new office space for our tenants, the London Environmental Network and Thames Talbot Land Trust, and built a second, publicly-rentable Community Board Room.

It was a year of growth on many levels, and we are thrilled to be opening our doors to even greater collaboration with the community.















Volunteers

Volunteers form the backbone of ReForest London. Their contributions span every facet of our organization, including tree planting, community outreach, tree giveaways, and active participation in the Board of Directors and our working committees.

In 2023, 1,206 dedicated volunteers contributed an outstanding 5,133 hours of service, significantly impacting our local environment and community. Their efforts in planting and nurturing trees have transformed empty spaces into lush green areas, providing healthier habitats for wildlife and enhancing the

2023 was a transitional year for ReForest London as some of our multi-year grant agreements came to a close, resulting in a reduction in both revenues and expenses.

While we continue to work hard to grow our corporate partnerships and earned revenue, ReForest London remains reliant on raising new grant money annually.

We continue to fundraise for and invest in the Westminster Ponds Centre, which is reflected in the increased value of our property, premises, and equipment. Substantial work was completed on the space in 2023.

Building our Restricted Operating and Capital Reserves is an increasingly important part of ReForest London's long-term financial plan. We made significant strides in this area in 2023, drawing on our operating surplus to meet our desired contribution level.

ReForest London has an active Finance Committee overseeing and guiding our budgeting, operations, and reporting. Davis Martindale LLP, our independent external auditor, issued an unmodified or "clean" audit opinion on the 2023 financial statements.
